

Boardings with Safety Violations

Most Common Violations

- Visual Distress Signals (33)
- Type IV/PFD/Life Ring (26)
- Insufficient/Unserviceable Fire Fighting Equipment (21)
- Documentation (20)
- Expired/Unregistered/Uninspected EPIRB (11)
- Navigation Lights/Sound Signal (5)
- Missing/Expired Life Raft (5)
- Insufficient/Unserviceable
 Immersion Suits (3)
- Inoperable bilge alarm (3)
- Improper Vessel Numbering (3)

- In 2018, 1057 total federal fisheries & safety boardings
 - 174 Safety Violations detected on 86 Vessels
 - 8% of vessels boarded had safety violations
 - Increase from 7% in 2017
 - 10 Voyage Terminations





Cutter Usage


Major Cutter Days









Fisheries Violations

- Significant logbook errors/No logbook (4)
- Boarding ladder (4)
- Failure to record catch on charter license (2)
- Passengers for hire without CHP (1)
- Fishing in Restricted area (1)
- ESA Violation (1)
