Ecosystem Committee: Path Forward.

There is an opportunity for the Council to better utilize the Ecosystem Committee, both in addressing imme diate issues of the day, and by taking a longer term view for how the Council could take a leadership role in the continuing evolution of EBM. This has been discussed at recent Committee meetings, and is reflected in their minutes from this meeting

In order to best take advantage of this opportunity the Council:

- 1. Will identify from time to time issues that require immediate attention and refer them to the Ecosystem Committee. In the near term those issues could include EFH consultations, conservation of deep sea corals, marine canyons, or emerging ESA issues such as right whales.
- 2. Tasks the Committee to continue work on further refinement and implementation of the Aleutian Island FEP.
- 3. Tasks the Committee to consider longer term EBM approaches and opportunities. Examples could include further work with respect to the Arctic FMP and changing conditions in the Arctic, refining approaches to EBM and integrating science into management decisions in a practical manner appropriate to North Pacific fisheries, or refining concepts of adaptive management and monitoring to ensure that management measures are meeting goals over time.

The Council will schedule a report from the Committee and discussion by the Council at its {June? October?} meeting. The Council is requesting the Committee develop a proposed workplan for Council adoption and i mplementation of longer-term EBM approaches as part of its report.

Status of 'Items for Future Meetings' from the 3-meeting outlook

A list of previously tasked items are included on the lower right corner of the 3-meeting outlook. This summary provides information on the status of these items.

Crab PSC numbers to weight: Discussion Paper

In June 2010, as part of the motion to initiate crab bycatch limits in all BSAI groundfish fisheries, the council briefly discussed the possibility of establishing crab caps by weight, rather than in numbers of crab. In June 2011, the Council explicitly tasked staff to prepare a separate discussion paper to evaluate changing the catch accounting of BSAI crab PSC from numbers to weight. This issue is being evaluated to some degree as part of the discussion paper from this meeting on crab bycatch limits in BSAI groundfish fisheries, which could inform future direction on this issue. Alternatively, we could pursue this directly outside of any longer-term initiative to evaluate crab PSC limits in groundfish fisheries.

Salmon EFH Revisions: Initial Review

At the time the Council took action on the 2010 EFH 5-year review, the AFSC was in the midst of developing a new methodology for refining EFH descriptions for salmon species. The Council opted to postpone action on updating the EFH sections of the Salmon FMP until the new methodology was ready for use. The methodology has now been peer-reviewed and published as a NOAA Technical Memorandum. In this amendment analysis, the Council would consider replacing the existing salmon EFH descriptions with the more refined descriptions resulting from the new AFSC methodology. Initial Review of the analysis will be scheduled when NMFS HD, AFSC, and Council staff time becomes available.

Bering Sea Sablefish FO and non-IFO specifications: Discussion Paper

At the December 2012 Council meeting, Council member Fields requested a discussion paper be prepared to examine the potential of allowing more flexibility in the specification of non-IFQ sablefish. The BSAI Groundfish FMP currently specifies TAC allocations of sablefish by subarea as follows. Vessels using fixed gear may harvest no more than 50% of the TAC in the Bering Sea and 75% of the TAC in the Aleutian Islands; vessels using trawl gear may harvest no more than 50% of the TAC in the Bering Sea and 25% of the TAC in the Aleutian Islands. Additional clarification of the intent of this paper is needed.

BSAI halibut PSC limit: Discussion Paper

At its December 2009 meeting, the Council requested a discussion paper on the process for changing the halibut Prohibited Species Catch (PSC) limits in the GOA and the BSAI. In February 2010, the Council requested separate discussion papers for each area, and set GOA halibut PSC limits as its first priority. In June 2012, the Council took action to reduce action to reduce halibut PSC caps in the GOA by up to 15%. At that time, the Council also reviewed a discussion paper prepared by Northern Economics containing background information on halibut bycatch caps in the BSAI and the process for revising them. The Council took no action at that time, however, in December 2012, Council member Cotton indicated his interest in revisiting this issue in the future.

EGOA Skate Fishery: Discussion paper

At the December Council meeting, the Council heard testimony requesting that a directed skate fishery with longlines be allowed in the Eastern Gulf of Alaska. Skates have not been open to directed fisheries in Federal waters for many years. In 2012, the EGOA catch of big skates (38 mt) was well below the TAC (1,202 mt) and, similarly, the catch of longnose skates (78 mt) was well below the TAC (676 mt). A discussion paper is being prepared for review in September by the GOA groundfish plan team for their recommendation before it is brought to the Council in October.

Greenland Turbot Allocation: Initial Review

In June 2012, the Council received a staff presentation summarizing the BSAI Greenland turbot longline and trawl fisheries and information relative to possible sector allocations for the BSAI Greenland turbot fishery. Discussions have occurred between the Freezer Longline Coalition and the Amendment 80 Cooperatives to reach non-regulatory agreement to manage Greenland turbot catch in the Bering Sea and Aleutian Islands subareas, but to date those cooperatives have not been able to reach agreement on measures to ensure the directed fishery remains open. Because the cooperatives have not yet reached agreement, the Council voted in June 2012 to move ahead by adopting a draft purpose and need statement, and alternatives for analysis. In December, the Council agreed to put the analysis on hold until the results of the 2013 fishery become available.

MPA Nominations: Discuss and Consider Nominations

In December 2009, the Council reviewed a discussion paper on the MPA nomination process, including a revised list of closure areas that appear to be eligible for inclusion into the national system of MPAs. The paper is posted: http://www.alaskafisheries.noaa.gov/npfmc/PDFdocuments/meetings/MPA_1209.pdf
Based on its review, the Council tasked staff to prepare a follow-up discussion paper that would incorporate anticipated guidance on the NOAA interpretation of 'avoid harm to the extent practicable', and evaluate the council's existing quasi marine reserves (i.e., Option 2 from the December 2009 discussion paper -- seamounts, AI coral gardens, Bowers Ridge, GOA coral HAPC areas, Sitka pinnacles, and Steller sea lion 3-nm no-transit zones) relative to the avoiding harm from the effects of fishing on these areas. The paper will also review the original list of eligible MPAs forwarded by the MPA center and develop draft justification of why sites would or would not be recommended for inclusion into the national system of MPAs. Further, the paper would discuss how a MPA nomination process could potentially interface with the EFH/HAPC process specified in the FMPs. Further work on the discussion paper has been put on hold until NOAA issues guidance on the interpretation of 'avoid harm'.
