



Utility of economic information

- EDRs are not specifically MSA-mandated, not legallyrequired for decision-making
- Mandated by the Council/ requested by Council bodies to meet analytical requirements
- And to be used as a flexible tool to improve understanding of the social and economic context related to fisheries to enable better informed decisions
