REPORT TO THE NORTH PACIFIC FISHERIES MANAGEMENT COUNCIL CONCERNING COAST GUARD FCMA ENFORCEMENT

- 1. Recent FCMA Infractions. Since the last Council meeting, no reports of violations (civil penalty procedures) and four citations (written warnings) have been issued. A brief summary of each infraction is as follows:
- a. 27 September. The Soviet Trawler PASIONARIYA was issued a citation by USCGC BOUTWELL for failure to have cumulative catch logs from previous trips during 1978.
- b. 28 September. The Japanese Trawler FUKUI MARU NO. 10 was issued a citation by USCGC MORGENTHAU for failure to properly record catch in daily cummulative catch log.
- c. 29 September. The Soviet Trawler TURKUL was issued a citation by USCGC BOUTWELL for failure to have cumulative catch logs from previous trips during 1978.
- d. 12 October. The Soviet Trawler PYOTOR OVCHINNIKOV was issued a citation by USCGC BOUTWELL for failure to have cumulative catchlogs from previous trips.
