Report To The North Pacific Fishery Management Council Concerning U. S. Coast Guard MFCMA Enforcement

- 1. <u>U. S. Coast Guard enforcement effort</u>. U. S. Coast Guard enforcement efforts for Calendar Year 1984, to date, have totalled 780 cutter patrol days and 3039 aircraft patrol hours for over 521,372 patrol miles. Combined enforcement efforts have resulted in three seizures, and the issuance of thirty-two reports of violation and 117 written warnings. Additional patrol effort analysis is included in the enclosures.
- 2. High Seas Drift Gillnet Fishery. On five different occasions during August 1984, Coast Guard HC-130 flights located numerous Japanese high seas drift gillnet vessels operating north of the Government of Japan (GOJ) imposed boundary of 44 degrees North latitude. Photographs taken by the patrolling HC-130's revealed the identities of many of the gillnet vessels. This information was subsequently relayed via the State Department to the GOJ who then conducted their own investigation into the matter. As a result of their investigation the GOJ plans to impose a one week sanction on those vessels positively identified as violators. This sanction will occur during the middle of next year's season and will effectively mean a loss of three weeks of fishing to those vessels involved.
- 3. Recent MFCMA infractions. Since the last report made to the Council (19 September), Coast Guard enforcement efforts have resulted in six reports of violation (civil penalty procedures) and forty written warnings issued to foreign fishing vessels. The following briefly summarizes the major infractions and enforcement activity:
 - a. In September, CCGDSEVENTEEN (oil) issued written warnings to the following vessels for failure to submit the required activity message twenty-four hours prior to beginning/ceasing fishing activity within the Fishery Conservation Zone: DAIKAN MARU, BOOK NEUNG, KHRUSTALNYI BEREG, NIPPONHAM MARU No. 1, KORENGA, and MYS EGOROVA.

- b. 20 September. USCGC MIDGETT issued a written warning to the Soviet stern trawler MYS GROZNY for fishing within the Fishery Conservation Zone without a current permit.
- c. 23 September. USCGC STORIS issued a written warning to the Japanese stern trawler KAIUN MARU No. 78 for failure to respond to visual signals to stop for boarding.
- d. 28 September. USCGC SHERMAN issued a written warning to the Japanese stern trawler EIKYU MARU No. 81 for failure to sort catch and return prohibited species as soon as possible after retrieval of the net.
- e. In October, CCGDSEVENTEEN (oil) issued written warnings to the following vessels for failure to submit the required activity message twenty-four hours prior to beginning/ceasing fishing activity within the Fishery Conservation Zone: SULAK, RYUJIN MARU No. 11, KYOWA MARU No. 15, AND HOKO MARU No. 31.
- f. 4 October. USCGC SHERMAN issued a written warning to the Japanese stern trawler EIKYU MARU No. 2 for failure to provide a safe boarding ladder.
- g. 16 October. USCGC SHERMAN issued a written warning to the Taiwanese stern trawler CHIEF DRAGON No. 737 for failure to respond to visual signals to heave to for boarding.
- h. 23 October. USCGC SHERMAN issued a report of violation to the Portugese side trawler ESTAVAO GOMES for failure to maintain a Daily Cumulative Catch Log. A written warning was also issued for failure to return prohibited species to the sea as soon as catch was sorted.
- i. 24 October. USCGC SHERMAN issued two written warnings to the Japanese stern trawler ANYO MARU No. 12 for failure to provide a safe boarding ladder and failure to return prohibited species as soon as catch was sorted.
- j. 24 October. USCGC SHERMAN issued a written warning to the Japanese stern trawler ANYO MARU No. 15 for failure to accurately maintain the Daily Cumulative Catch Log.
- k. 27 October. USCGC SHERMAN issued a written warning to the Japanese stern trawler ANYO MARU No. 11 for failure to provide a safe boarding ladder.
- 1. 31 October. USCGC JARVIS issued two reports of violation and two written warnings to the Japanese stern trawler ANYO MARU No. 12. Reports of violation were issued for failure to provide a safe boarding ladder and failure to return prohibited species as soon as catch was sorted. Written warnings were issued for failure to properly maintain their International Radio Call Sign (IRCS) and for impeding the boarding party by securing power to the radio room as the boarding party was inspecting it.

- m. In November (Through 20 November), CCGDSEVENTEEN (oil) issued written warnings to the following vessels for failure to submit required activity message twenty-four hours prior to beginning/ceasing fishing activity within the Fishery Conservation Zone: DAIEI MARU No. 2, DAINICHI MARU No. 31, MABAH, NIKOLAEVSKIY KORABEL, KOSHIN MARU No. 11, No. 303 DAI HO, SHOKEN MARU, SOVGANJ, STARLING, No. 6 CHIL BO SAN, SEITOKU MARU No. 105, TENKAI MARU, TAISEI MARU No. 26, SWALLOW, AND MORS.
- n. 3 November. USCGC JARVIS issued a report of violation to the Japanese longliner HATSUE MARU No. 68 for failure to send required message traffic indicating their intent to shift fishing areas.
- o. 13 November. CCGDSEVENTEEN (oil) issued written warnings to the Soviet trawlers KALAR and TEKHNOLOG for fishing within the Fishery Conservation Zone without a permit.
- p. 15 November. CCGDSEVENTEEN (oil) again issued a written warning to the Soviet stern trawler TEKHNOLOG for fishing within the Fishery Conservation Zone without a permit.
- q. 17 November. USCGC JARVIS issued two reports of violation to the Polish stern trawler GRINWAL for failure to accurately log incidental catch of prohibited species on two occasions.
