

Principal Focus on Resource Protection

- Maintain balance between resource conservation and sustainable uses over time
- Employ innovative, community-based problem solving with a focus on non-regulatory solutions
- Regulations are customized to meet the needs, features of individual sanctuaries
- Can issue permits to allow certain activities
- Sanctuaries focus on compatible use
- Enforcement of laws and regulations involves education



Fishing in Sanctuaries

- Diverse fishing communities within each sanctuary and monument
- National Marine Sanctuaries Act (NMSA) requires NOAA to consider economic benefits and impacts of present and potential uses
- NMSA 304(a)(5) Developing Fishing Regulations
- All Sanctuary Advisory Councils include 1 to 3 council seats reserved for fishing interests

Sanctuary Nominations – Process Steps

- 1. Community builds a Nomination
- 2. Community submits Nomination to ONMS
- 3. ONMS conducts initial sufficiency review
- 4. Review team convenes and reviews nomination against 11 criteria
- 5. Regional Director and PAPD Chief make recommendation to Director
- 6. Director accepts or declines nomination. If accepted, added to Inventory
- If 5 years pass and Nominated Area does not move to Sanctuary Designation Process then a 5-year review is conducted to determine if site still meets criteria







11 NOAA Criteria & Considerations



- National Significance Criteria:
 - 1: Natural Resources
 - 2: Heritage Resources
 - 3: Socio-economic Importance
 - 4: Public Benefit

- Management Considerations:
 - 1: Research Opportunities
 - 2: Education Opportunities
 - 3: Threats
 - 4: New Conservation Benefits
 - 5: Supplemental Protection
 - 6: Partner Commitments
 - 7: Community Support

Reminders About Evaluation Criteria



- No minimum number of national significance criteria
- No greater significance to any particular criterion
- Strongest nominations will provide a clear connection and focus on the national significance criteria most relevant to the goal and intent for the nominated area
- Nominations should provide information addressing all seven management considerations

December 17, 2021:

• Nomination submitted

January 21, 2022:

• Sufficiency Review complete

January - May 2022:

- Review Team met on Feb. 17
- Visit to St. George and St. Paul Islands
- Review & Analysis Conducted

June 8, 2022:

 Alaĝum Kanuux National Marine Sanctuary added to NOAA Inventory of Successful Nominations


