Report To The North Pacific Fishery Management
Council Concerning U. S. Coast Guard MFCMA Enforcement

1. U. S. COAST GUARD ENFORCEMENT EFFORT FOR 1985. U.S. Coast Guard enforcement efforts for Calendar Year 1985, through 19 March, have totalled 170 cutter patrol days and 387 aircraft patrol hours for over 71,676 patrol miles. Combined enforcement efforts have resulted in the issuance of nine reports of violation and nineteen written warnings. Additional patrol effort analysis is provided in the enclosures.
2. RECENT MFCMA INFRACTIONS. Since the last report made to the Council (23 January 1985), Coast Guard enforcement efforts have resulted in five reports of violation (civil penalty procedures) and fourteen written warnings being issued to foreign fishing vessels. The following briefly summarizes the major infractions and enforcement activity:
 - a. In January, CCGDSEVENTEEN (oil) issued a written warning to the Japanese tanker vessel TENSUN MARU for failure to submit the required activity message twenty-four hours prior to beginning fishing operations within the Fishery Conservation Zone.
 - b. 1 January. USCGC YOCONA issued two written warnings to the Polish stern trawler AQUILA for failure to accurately maintain their Daily Cumulative Catch Log.
 - c. 12 January. USCGC YOCONA issued two reports of violation to the Polish stern trawler MARLIN for failure to properly maintain their Daily Cumulative Catch Log.
 - d. 18 January. USCGC RUSH issued a written warning to the Polish stern trawler PERSEUS for failure to properly maintain their transfer log.
 - e. 18 January. USCGC RUSH issued a written warning to the Polish stern trawler ZULAWY for failure to properly maintain their transfer log.
 - f. 20 January. USCGC RUSH issued a written warning to the Polish stern trawler CASSIOPEIA for failure to properly maintain their Daily Cumulative Catch Log.

g. 25 January. USCGC STORIS issued a written warning to the Soviet stern trawler MYS BELKINA for failure to have their International Radio Call Sign (IRCS) painted on an appropriate weather deck.

h. 6 February. USCGC MORGENTHAU issued a report of violation to the Japanese stern trawler HAMAYOSHI MARU NO. 63 for failure to accurately maintain their Daily Cumulative Catch Log.

i. 10 February. USCGC MIDGETT issued a written warning to the South Korean transport vessel OCEAN VIOLET for failure to keep their International Radio Call Signs in clear view.

j. 14 February. COGARD AIRSTA KODIAK issued a written warning to the Soviet stern trawler KLUCHEVSKY for fishing within the Fishery Conservation Zone without first submitting the required begin activity message.

k. 16 February. USCGC MIDGETT issued a written warning to the Soviet stern trawlers KALAR, LOTOS, TERNEI, and SYEZD PROFSOYOZOV for fishing within the Fishery Conservation Zone without first submitting the required begin activity message.

l. 20 February. USCGC MORGENTHAU issued a written warning to the Polish stern trawler AWIOR for failure to properly maintain their Daily Cumulative Catch Log.

m. 2 March. USCGC YOCONA issued a report of violation to the Portugese side trawler ESTAVAO GOMES for failure to have their International Radio Call SIGN (IRCS) painted on an appropriate weather deck and failure to keep the IRCS's on the hull in clear view.

n. 10 March. USCGC MIDGETT issued a report of violation to the Japanese longliner KIYO MARU NO. 55 for failure to accurately maintain their Daily Cumulative Catch Log.
