UPDATE ON 2020 TRAWL EM PROGRAM

- Trawl EM fishing in 2020 in the BS and GOA pollock fisheries, under EFP, funded by NFWF grants
 - BS/CGOA: 27 active vessels in 2020
 - WGOA: 16 vessels + 3 tenders
- Largely successful despite COVID-19 disruptions
 - EFP team's frequent communication is key to adaptable problem solving
 - Vessel operators increasingly learning systems, procedures
 - Detail in the minutes







COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR 2021 TRAWL EFP

1. Support adding 26 new vessels to Trawl EM EFP in 2021

- Brings all eligible trawl vessels fishing pollock into the program
- Funding: some in hand, some anticipated through upcoming NFWF grant

2. Support specific changes to some EFP requirements in 2021

Detailed in the minutes

3. Continue working towards 2023 trawl EM implementation

Recommend asking NMFS to see if EFP can be extended for 2022 gap year

Recommend Council support of industry applications for 2022 funding



PLAN FOR TRAWL EM REGULATORY ANALYSIS

 Committee requests Council stay on schedule for 2023 implementation

Regulatory analysis target milestones:

- ➤ June 2021: Council approves alts
- ➤ December 2021: initial review
- ➤ February 2022: final action
- ➤ January 2023: implementation



ALASKA REGIONAL ELECTRONIC TECHNOLOGIES IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

- Update of existing plan, for 2020-2024
 - Final needs to be submitted to NMFS HQ in February 2021
 - NMFS will review with FMAC in May 2021 (and Council in June), and submit any resulting revisions
- Committee provided feedback on vision statement, priorities
- EM cost reporting:
 - Working to come up with consistent EM cost reporting categories across programs (fixed gear/trawl gear, and consistent across providers)



Trawl EM regulated program: working to identify which funding mechanism (pay as you go, observer fee, cost recovery) appropriate for each cost category
