North Pacific Fisheries Association (NPFA) would once again like to commend the Bering Sea Fishery Ecosystem Plan Team on the work they have accomplished. Developing a Fishery Ecosystem Plan (FEP) is a monumental task and we are proud of our regional Council for taking the lead on developing a second regional FEP that promotes the inclusion of ecosystem science and stakeholder input in management decisions. The Bering Sea FEP is a productive way to add value to the Council process and stakeholders: by providing clarity to all stakeholders about what decisions are being made and why, providing a conduit between best available data and informed decision makers, and the provision of strategic planning opportunities for research or management by recognizing region-wide stock, climate or ecosystem changes. While the Council has a history of making informed and conservation-minded decisions, this FEP will further improve the information available to all Council bodies.
