1. U. S. COAST GUARD FISHERIES ENFORCEMENT EFFORT FOR PERIOD
1 JAN - 31 MAR 1988.

a. From 1 January to 31 March 1988, four cutters have spent 119 days in fisheries enforcement patrols in the waters off Alaska, and Coast Guard C-130 and H-3 aircraft flew 26 missions for a total of 172 hours on fisheries enforcement patrols. Primary enforcement emphasis was placed on monitoring U.S. EEZ boundary in the Bering Sea and foreign fishing activities in the "donut hole".

b. During this period no directed foreign fishing was authorized in the U.S. EEZ. Enclosure (1) is a summary of Alaska region federal fisheries closures. To date 182 foreign fishing vessels have received permits to conduct joint venture (JV) operations and 228 foreign transport vessels have received permits to conduct support operations. A total of 91 foreign vessels checked in to the EEZ to conduct JV operations during the period. 1,637 U.S. catcher vessels have received federal permits for JVP and DAP fishing. 141 U.S. catcher-processors have received federal permits. 36 U.S. catcher-processors checked in during the period.

c. Coast Guard cutter and aircraft patrols reported sightings of 182 FFV's and 508 U.S. fishing vessels within the U.S. EEZ (note - on many occasions these are multiple sightings of one vessel). 12 foreign vessels and 60 U.S. vessels were boarded and inspected for compliance with the Magnuson Fisheries Conservation Management Act. Enclosure (2) provides detailed breakdown of patrol effort and results by month and nation. Due to no foreign directed fishing and enforcement emphasis in and around the "donut hole", sightings and boardings within the EEZ were limited.

d. Cutters on patrol were also involved in the following significant Search and Rescue (SAR) cases and patrol interruptions:

2. MFCMA ENFORCEMENT SUMMARY.

a. The following is a summary of Magnuson Act enforcement action during the period 1 January - 31 March 1988:

1) 20 January 1988. CCGDSEVENTEEN(ole) issued report of violation to USSR transport OSTROV SHMIDTA for failure to submit cease message for fishing operations in 1987.

2) 20 January 1988. CCGDSEVENTEEN(ole) issued report of violation to USSR transport CHUKOTSKYI BEREG for failure to submit cease message for fishing operations in 1987.

3) 30 January 1988. NMFS agents seized Japanese transport SHINWA MARU for conducting transfer with U.S. catcher processor ALASKAN HERO without proper permit in a closed area.

4) 02 February 1988. USCGC BOUTWELL seized U.S. catcher processor ALASKAN HERO for conducting transfer with JA transport SHINWA MARU in a closed area.

5) 09 February 1988. CCGDSEVENTEEN(ole) issued report of violation to South Korean stern trawler NO. 71 DONG BANG for conducting transfer operations in a closed area.

6) 09 February 1988. CCGDSEVENTEEN(ole) issued report of violation to Japanese transport FUJISHIO MARU for conducting transfer operations in a closed area.

7) 19 February 1988. CCGDSEVENTEEN(ole) issued report of violations to Japanese stern trawlers EIKYU MARU NO. 6, EIKYU MARU NO. 81, KORYO MARU NO. 52, TAISAI MARU NO. 21, and HK1-850 for conducting directed fishing without a permit in the EEZ on 13 January 1988. This case was based on evidence/statements provided by AFTA representatives and chartered aircraft crew who sighted and videotaped these vessels and two other unidentified vessels fishing in the EEZ.

8) 20 February 1988. USCGC STORIS issued report of violation to U.S. catcher-processor ALASKA I for conducting directed fishing for sablefish, where sablefish bycatch exceeded 20 percent.

9) 17 March 1988. USCGC RUSH issued report of violation to Chinese stern trawler YAN YUAN NO. 2 for failure to report all fish products aboard prior to entering EEZ.

10) 22 March 1988. USCGC STORIS issued report of violation to U.S. longliner GREEN HOPE for failure to have federal groundfish permit aboard.

- 11) 24 March 1988. USCGC STORIS issued three reports of violation to U.S. catcher-processor BROWN'S POINT for failure to return prohibited species in a timely manner, failure to submit shift message, and failure to include discarded catch in weekly catch report.
- 12) 25 March 1988. USCGC STORIS issued a report of violation to U.S. catcher-processor AMERICAN ENTERPRISE for failure to include prohibited species catch and discards in weekly catch report.
- 13) 26 March 1988. USCGC STORIS issued a report of violation to U.S. catcher-processor HARVESTER ENTERPRISE for failure to include prohibited species catch and discards in weekly catch report.
- 14) 28 March 1988. USCGC STORIS issued a report of violation to master of USSR stern trawler KIZIR for the assault on the assigned NMFS observer by a member of his crew.
- 15) 29 March 1988. USCGC STORIS issued a report of violation to Japanese stern trawler TAKACHIHO MARU for conducting directed joint venture operations for pollock where incidental pollock bycatch exceeded 20 percent.
- 16) 29 March 1988. USCGC STORIS issued a report of violation to Japanese stern trawler MIYAJIMA MARU for conducting directed joint venture operations for pollock where incidental pollock bycatch exceeded 20 percent.
- 17) 30 March 1988. USCGC STORIS issued a report of violation to Japanese stern trawler KOYO MARU NO. 2 for conducting directed joint venture operations for pollock where incidental pollock bycatch exceeded 20 percent.
- 18) 31 March 1988. USCGC STORIS issued a report of violation to U.S. stern trawler PACIFIC CHALLENGER for conducting directed joint venture fishing for pollock where incidental pollock bycatch exceeded 20 percent.
- 19) 31 March 1988. USCGC STORIS issued two reports of violation to U.S. stern trawler ARGOSY for conducting directed joint venture fishing for pollock where incidental pollock bycatch exceeded 20 percent, and for fishing without a valid Bering Sea federal fisheries permit.
- 20) 31 March 1988. USCGC STORIS issued report of violation to U.S. stern trawler PEGGY JO for conducting directed joint venture fishing for pollock where incidental pollock bycatch exceeded 20 percent.

21) 31 March 1988. USCGC STORIS issued report of violation to U.S. stern trawler LESLIE LEE for conducting directed joint venture fishing for pollock where incidental pollock bycatch exceeded 20 percent.

- b. Through 31 March, there were 2 seizures and 26 MFCMA reports of violations issued during calendar year 1988 as a result of Coast Guard sightings, boardings, and investigations. Summary by country follows:

- c. Additional items of interest relating to MFCMA enforcement:

1) On 19 February, the Polish stern trawler CASSIOPEIA was sighted by an AIRSTA KODIAK C-130 in the U.S. EEZ in position 56-44N, 176-14W and appeared to take evasive action to avoid surveillance. CASSIOPEIA was directed to enter Dutch Harbor where it was later boarded and released. Investigation revealed no evidence of illegal fishing in EEZ.

2) From 13 to 20 February, a NOAA P-3 weather aircraft was deployed to Naval Air Station Adak to conduct flights into and around the "donut hole". On 13 February, the following Polish stern trawlers were sighted fishing 1 to 2 NM inside the EEZ. NMFS investigation pending:

3) On 2 March, received a report from F/V STARRIGAVAN of sighting of a foreign fishing vessel (FFV) 20NM southeast of Shumagin Islands. Investigation revealed that the FFV was a Polish stern trawler transiting from the Bering Sea to Seward for an approved port call.

4) We have received a report of unidentified JV vessels possibly operating in the Bering Sea closed trawl area. surveillance flights over this area have not sighted any vessels in the closed area.

3. FOREIGN FISHING ACTIVITY IN THE INTERNATIONAL WATERS OF THE BERING SEA.

- a. Since the last report to the Council which covered the period 1 December 1987 through 6 January 1988, the Coast Guard has conducted 14 surveillance flights and three cutter patrols into the "donut hole". There were 125 sightings of foreign vessels and 71 foreign fishing vessels were identified. Breakdown by country and type of identified vessel follows:

- b. USCGC BOUTWELL while patrolling the "donut hole" requested and was denied permission to board one Japanese and two South Korean FFV's. BOUTWELL was able to conduct a consensual boarding of the Polish stern trawler WALEN on 26 January. Master of WALEN passed that fishing was poor. Additional information obtained from the boarding, including names of Polish vessels fishing in "donut hole" and summary of catch effort, was forwarded to NOAA Northwest and Alaska Fisheries Center, Seattle, WA.

4. FUTURE ENFORCEMENT PLANS.

USCG budget cuts for FY88 have forced a reduction in our fisheries enforcement efforts. From 1 March to 30 September 1988 cutters patrol days will be reduced 35% and aircraft surveillance flights will be reduced 55% when compared to the same period during 1987. These reductions will significantly affect our ability to detect and deter violations of the Magnuson Act in the EEZ, monitor foreign fishing activity in the "donut hole", enforce IPHC halibut openings, enforce INPFC regulations, and monitor foreign high seas squid driftnet fleets. We will do our best with the resources available and continue to keep the Council informed of the results of our efforts.
