Short-tailed Albatross

On November 16, 2010, staff at Midway Atoll National Wildlife Refuge observed an adult shorttailed albatross incubating a freshly laid egg. On January 17, 2011, the egg hatched! This is an exciting development in the recovery of the species because this is the first confirmed hatching of a short-tailed albatross outside of Japan in modern history. Refuge staff and volunteers are continuing to monitor the nest daily by remote video camera.
