### I. High Seas Drift Net (HSDN) Enforcement

USCGC MORGENTHAU patrolled the high seas waters of the North Pacific for 91 days, and returned to home port on 04 August. U.S. Coast Guard C-130s from Air Station Kodiak patrolled the North Pacific Anadromous Fish Commission (NPAFC) Convention Area for 184 flight hours over the reporting period, including two flights in April, eight flights in May, one flight in June, and eight flights in July. Five North Pacific Coast Guard Forum nations provided direct operational assets to the North Pacific Guard patrol in 2014, including efforts by the U.S., China, Russia, Japan, and Canada. Aviation patrols of the region were conducted by the U.S., Canada, Russia, and Japan. Japan Coast Guard conducted two joint Gulfstream-V flights coincidental with MORGENTHAU's patrol of the NPAFC Convention Area. These flights continued joint U.S.-Japanese HSDN aircraft patrol operations and sighted several fishing vessels, none of which were configured for large-scale high seas driftnet fishing.

Focused on detecting any illegal, unregulated or unreported (IUU) fishing, these patrol efforts were successful in identifying four vessels of interest (STELLAR, SOVEREIGN, GRIN, FABIAN) and one vessel suspected of engaging in HSDN activity (YIN YUAN). The vessels of interest were all detected along the border between Russia's EEZ and the high seas and are suspected of engaging in illegal transshipment. Based on reports from the USCG, the STELLAR and SOVEREIGN were inspected by Korean authorities during a port call in Busan, South Korea. An INTERPOL Purple Notice was released regarding the activities and appearance of

M/V STELLAR. Purple Notices provide information on modi operandi, objects, devices, and concealment methods used by criminals. As previously reported, the FF/V YIN YUAN was sighted transiting on the high seas displaying suspicious markings and HSDN paraphernalia on deck. On 26 May, MORGENTHAU supported a China CG-led boarding, IAW the terms of the U.S.-PRC MOU. Evidence of illegal fishing activity was discovered during the boarding and YIN YUAN was transferred to China Coast Guard

custody on 04 June 2014. On 11 August, following a two-month investigation, the master of the YIN YUAN received a maximum fine of 100,000 yuan (approximately \$16,300). The case was forwarded to the Chinese Ministry of Agriculture for further investigation and potential prosecution of the owner of the YIN YUAN.

USCGC MORGENTHAU conducted three boardings of Taiwanese fishing vessels pursuant to the Western and Central Pacific Fisheries Commission (WCPFC) with one minor violation detected.

### II. U.S./Russian Maritime Boundary Line (MBL) Enforcement

The Russian pollock fishery opened on 15 May, and activity has been moderate over the reporting period compared to historical levels. Typically, activity along the MBL is highest in August and September. As mentioned during previous reports, the number of vessels detected crossing into the U.S. EEZ has increased due to more robust tracking by electronic means (Russian VMS and AIS), although evidence of fishing activity cannot be determined by these means alone.

There were six shallow suspected incursions by the Chinese FF/V LIAN XING HAI and three shallow suspected incursions by the Russian FF/V GENERAL TROSHEV in July. These vessels were legally permitted to fish in the Russian EEZ. D17 exchanged information with our

Russian enforcement counterparts, and the Kamchatka Border Guard (KBG) issued warnings to these vessels. In August, there were 22 additional shallow suspected incursions into the U.S. EEZ by two Russian fishing vessels detected by electronic means. These vessels included the FF/V KAPITAN MASLOVETS, and FF/V ALTAIR, both of which were issued

warnings by the Kamchatka Border Guard after being contacted by D17. USCGC ALEX HALEY detected an 1100 yard incursion by the Russian FF/V ADMIRAL KOLCHAK actively fishing in the U.S. EEZ on 26 August. The vessel fled back into Russian waters and case information was forwarded to the KBG for further investigation. Additionally, the case is being vetted by USCG and NOAA for potential U.S. action. In September, FF/V KAPITAN MASLOVETS was suspected of incurring twice more into the U.S. EEZ.

### III. Steller Sea Lions (SSL) and Critical Habitat Enforcement

The Coast Guard monitors more than 151 critical habitat areas around the state as part of routine cutter and aircraft patrol activity. One violation of SSL critical habitat was detected over the reporting period when F/V ARCTIC RAM was witnessed transiting through the Akun Island and Billings Head No Entry Zones.

### IV. Fishing Vessel Boarding Statistics





Figure 2. Fisheries Violations by Year

There were 311 domestic fisheries and fishing vessel safety boardings conducted by the U.S. Coast Guard during the reporting period. These boardings resulted in a total of 216 safety violations onboard 130 vessels and eleven federal fisheries violations onboard nine vessels. Figures 1 and 2 show the historic trends for boardings and violations.

Figure 1. Fisheries Boardings By Year

### V. IFQ Halibut and Sablefish Enforcement


The Seventeenth District enforcement assets conducted 52 boardings on IFQ halibut or sablefish vessels during the reporting period. There were twenty counts of improper release of halibut bycatch on two different vessels, resulting in three significant violations. The improper methods used to release the halibut included allowing halibut to first run through a crucifer and allowing halibut to contact the ship, causing an improper stripping of the hook. In addition, there were three vessels issued significant violations for unlawful possession of halibut.

### VI. Commercial Fishing Vessel Safety/Search and Rescue Cases

During the reporting period, 229 safety violations were detected on 133 vessels. There were 25 voyage terminations during the reporting period. A comprehensive list of violations can be found in Appendix C.

There were 54 SAR cases, resulting in fourteen lives saved, and one life lost. Appendix A provides a comprehensive list of search and rescue cases involving fishing vessels over the reporting period.

Figure 4. Annual HC-130 Hours





Figure 5. Annual Major Cutter Days

Figure 6. Jun - Sep HC-130 Hours





Figure 7. Jun - Sep Major Cutter Days
