> NATIONAL MARINE FISHERIES SERVICE ENFORCEMENT REPORT FOR THE PERIOD SEPTEMBER 1 THROUGH OCTOBER 31, 1993

During the reporting period NMFS and the Coast Guard opened a total of 177 investigations. NMFS initiated 114 investigations. 12 of these cases originated from the observer program.

Further actions were also taken on 146 pending case during the reporting period. 9 investigations were closed as unfounded. One investigations was closed due to lack of enforcement resources. 15 cases were handled with written warnings and 12 cases were handled with summary settlement offers totaling \$16,713 in assessed penalties. 63 cases were settled through voluntary abandonment with property valued at \$45,011. 13 cases were referred to NOAA General Counsel. General Counsel issued 17 Notices of Violation assessing a total of \$149,071 in penalties. An additional 15 Notices of Violation were settled by General Counsel with penalties totalling \$33,525. One District Court civil forfeiture case was settled for \$260,000.

Observer initiated cases resulted in 3 written warnings, 6 referrals to other agencies, 1 dismissal due to lack of enforcement resources and 2 assignments for further investigation.

Enforcement actions initiated during the September 1 - October 31 period included:

- 1) Sept 7, 1993 The trawl vessel ALASKA DAWN was cited in Dutch Harbor, AK, for exceeding directed fishing standards for Pacific cod by 93 percent. \$707 in proceeds from the sale of 7,077 lbs. of Pacific cod were forfeited. Respondent paid a \$750 summary settlement. The vessel hails from Sand Point, Alaska.
- 2) Sept 9, 1993 The longline vessel SIRRAH was cited in Homer, AK, for possession of a hook stripper during halibut fishing operations. Disposition of the case is pending.
- 3) Sept 13, 1993 The longline vessel SY-WASH was cited in Kodiak, AK, for exceeding a halibut trip limit by 12 percent. \$591 in proceeds from the sale of 481 lbs. of halibut were forfeited. Respondent paid a \$674 summary settlement. The vessel hails from Kodiak, Alaska.
- 4) Sept 14, 1993 The longline vessel TRINA SUE was cited in Kodiak, AK, for exceeding a halibut trip limit by 16 percent. \$219 in proceeds from the sale of 147 lbs. of halibut were forfeited. Respondent paid a \$183 summary settlement. The vessel hails from Kodiak, Alaska.



- 5) Sept 15, 1993 The longline vessel BEAR CLAW was cited in Kodia AK, for exceeding a halibut trip limit by 18 percent. \$2,193 in proceeds from the sale of 1,502 lbs. of halibut were forfeited. Respondent paid a \$1,877 summary settlement. The vessel hails from Kodiak, Alaska.
- 6) Sept 15, 1993 The longline vessel TINA MARIE was cited in Kodiak, AK, for exceeding a halibut trip limit by 23 percent. \$1,280 in proceeds from the sale of 890 lbs. of halibut were forfeited. Respondent paid a \$1,112 summary settlement. The vessel hails from Kodiak, Alaska.
- 7) Sept 16, 1993 The trawl vessel ALASKA DAWN was cited in Dutch Harbor, AK, for exceeding directed fishing standards for Pacific cod by 285 percent. \$2,143 in proceeds from the sale of 21,435 lbs. of Pacific cod were forfeited. Respondent paid a \$750 summary settlement. The vessel hails from Sand Point, Alaska.
- 8) Sept 16, 1993 The trawl vessel GOLDEN PRIDE was cited in Dutch Harbor, AK, for exceeding directed fishing standards for Pacific cod by 48 percent. \$616 in proceeds from the sale of 6,165 lbs. of Pacific cod were forfeited. Respondent paid a \$750 summary settlement. The vessel hails from Port Townsend, Oregon.
- 9) Sept 17, 1993 The longline vessel ELIZABETH F was cited in Dutch Harbor, AK, for exceeding a halibut trip limit by 16 percent. \$6,064 in proceeds from the sale of 4,740 lbs. of halibut were forfeited. Respondent paid a \$5,925 summary settlement. The vessel hails from Kodiak, Alaska.
- 10) Sept 17, 1993 The trawl vessel GOLDEN PRIDE was cited in Dutch Harbor, AK, for exceeding directed fishing standards for Pacific cod by 82 percent. \$1,042 in proceeds from the sale of 10,428 lbs. of Pacific cod were forfeited. Respondent paid a \$750 summary settlement. The vessel hails from Port Townsend, Oregon.
- 11) Sept 17, 1993 The operator of the guided sport fishing vessel TROPHY KING was cited at Homer, AK, for discharging a firearm at or near a Steller sea lion. The incident occurred during June in Cook Inlet. The investigation was initiated by the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service. Disposition of the case is pending.
- 12) Sept 29, 1993 The trawl vessel MAR PACIFICO was cited in Kodiak, AK, for exceeding directed fishing standards for Pacific cod by 34 percent. \$522 in proceeds from the sale of 3,775 lbs. of Pacific cod were forfeited. Respondent paid a \$750 summary settlement.

Enforcement actions initiated prior to the September 1/October 31 period which were not previously reported included:

1) June 28, 1993 - The longline vessel SABRA ANN was cited in Sitka, AK, for failure to obtain an IPHC license. The respondent paid a \$7 summary settlement. The vessel hails from Juneau, Alaska.

- 2) August 17, 1993 The trawl vessel MAR DEL NORTE was cited at Dutch Harbor, AK, for exceeding directed fishing standards for Pacific cod by 156 percent. \$617 in proceeds from the sale of 2,462 lbs. of Pacific cod were forfeited. Respondent paid a \$750 summary settlement.
- 3) August 25, 1993 the longline vessel BLUE FIN was cited for failure to have a federal groundfish permit, failure to maintain required logbooks, and failure to obtain 30% observer coverage during 1992 fishing operations. Investigation was initiated by the observer programs. The vessel hails from Seattle, WA. Disposition of the case is pending.

FISHING COMPANY, OFFICIALS, PLEAD GUILTY TO ALTERING OFFICIAL LOGBOOK

Emerald Resource Management, Inc., a Seattle-based fishing-management company, and Per Pevik, Vice President of Operations for Emerald, have pled guilty to felony charges of concealing material information from the National Marine Fisheries Service. Emerald entered its guilty plea in the U.S. District Court in Anchorage, Alaska, on October 26, 1993. Per Pevik entered his plea on November 18, 1993.

The guilty pleas were the result of an extensive two-year investigation by Special Agents of the National Marine Fisheries Service.

Emerald and Pevik admitted to altering fishing logbook entries to coverup evidence of incursions into an area closed to fishing at Round Island, Alaska. The purpose of the alterations were to avoid enforcement action for possible incursions into the closed area. A total of nine fishing vessels were seized by the U.S. Coast Guard during the summer of 1991 for fishing within the Round Island closed area.

Emerald and Pevik each pled guilty to one count of concealing and covering up a material fact in violation of 18 U.S.C. section 1001. The maximum penalty for violation of this section by a corporation is a \$500,000 fine. The maximum penalty for an individual is five years imprisonment and/or a \$250,000 fine. Emerald agreed to pay a \$350,000 fine as part of a plea agreement.

The master and mate of the Saga Sea at that time of the logbook alterations, Frank Vargas and Vince Crisci, Jr., have also entered into agreements to plead guilty to violations of the Magnuson Conservation and Management Act for their actions in changing the logbook. Vargas pled guilty on October 20, 1993, to submitting false information to the National Marine Fisheries Service in violation of 16 U.S.C. Section 1857(1)(I). This offense carries a maximum penalty of six months imprisonment and/or a \$100,000 fine. Crisci is set to plead guilty to the same charge within the next few weeks.

Sentencing for all defendants is expected to take place sometime during the next few months.

U.S. COAST GUARD FISHERIES ENFORCEMENT FOR PERIOD September 1, 1993 through November 30, 1993

1. ENFORCEMENT/SAFETY SUMMARY

A. SEPTEMBER HALIBUT OPENING

Coast Guard patrolling presence during the September halibut opening included nine cutters, two Group Ketchikan Stations, and aircraft from Kodiak, Cordova and Sitka, as well as a deployed Falcon jet from Astoria. Over two hundred boardings were conducted. Common violations noted were retention of undersized halibut, fishing without an IPHC license onboard, and failure to maintain/update halibut logs. Of particular note was the fishing vessel GREEN HOPE, which was cited for retention of 102 short halibut. The Coast Guard also increased its patrolling prescense this year during the Bering Sea halibut openers.

Coast Guard patrolling units noted a marked improvement in fleet safety between the June and September openers. For the most part only relatively minor violations occurred. Only one fishing vessel, the BAY PROWLER, had its voyage terminated; the reason was insufficient survival suits. In comparison, six fishing vessels had their voyages terminated during the June halibut opener.

In response to industry concerns, the Coast Guard provided guidance to patrolling units to expedite boardings during the six hours prior to the opener, recognizing this is a busy period in making preparations to fish and locating primary grounds.

B. US/RS CONVENTION LINE

Japanese trawlers operated throughout the period in the Russian zone along the Convention Line north of the donut hole. The Coast Guard monitored their activity with overt and covert surveillance flights and periodic cutter presence to deterincursions into the US EEZ.

C. BERING SEA KING CRAB FISHERY

In response to safety concerns associated with this intense fishery in November, the Coast Guard provided either a cutter presence in the East Bering or a deployed helicopter in Cold Bay. There were no major SAR incidents requiring CG resources during the 1-10 November opener.

D. FY93 ENFORCEMENT TRENDS

Attached to this report are two graphs highlighting CG patrol effort and boarding statistics. The increased cutter resources on ALPAT between FY91 and FY93 reflect the completion of the Fleet Rehabilitation and Modernization (FRAM) project on our 378' High Endurance cutters, and the relocation of 2 such cutters to the West Coast. As expected fishing vessels dominate the boarding numbers in the region. Of particular note, are encouraging trends, as observed by the CG, in compliance with both fisheries and safety regulations. In FY91 18 per cent of the fishing vessels boarded were cited for fisheries violations; in FY93 it was down to 12 per cent. Safety violations have seen a similar reduction in violations from 50 per cent to 32 per cent; loss of life has also been lower. May the downward trend continue.


